- ◆ Te Taha Wairua - *spiritual component*
- ◆ Te Taha Hinengaro - *mental component*
- ◆ Te Taha Tinana - *physical component*
- ◆ Te Taha Whanau - *whanau component*

It will be delivered in the acknowledgement that Te Reo Rangatira is an essential part of the holistic concept of Te Ao Maori

Our four main services which we provide are:

- ◆ Specialist Cultural Support & Needs Assessment
- ◆ Elder Abuse & Neglect Prevention
- ◆ Kaumatua Kuia Day Activity Programme
- ◆ Community Support Services

COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES

We provide supports to kaumatua, kuia and their whanau who require access to specialised services including:-

- ◆ Kaumatua Kuia Day Activity Programme (*certain criteria need to be met*)
- ◆ Cultural expertise
- ◆ Cultural safety
- ◆ Te Reo Maori
- ◆ Casework (kaumatua, kuia and whanau)
- ◆ Advocacy and practical assistance
- ◆ Liaison assistance with WINZ, ACC, HNZ etc
- ◆ Supports for kaumatua/kuia who have been diagnosed with early dementia
- ◆ Referral to Occupational Therapist
- ◆ Referral to Physiotherapist
- ◆ Referral to Incontinence Nurse
- ◆ Carer support
- ◆ Whanau support (including monitoring and development)
- ◆ Evaluations on service efficiency
