

Eligibility



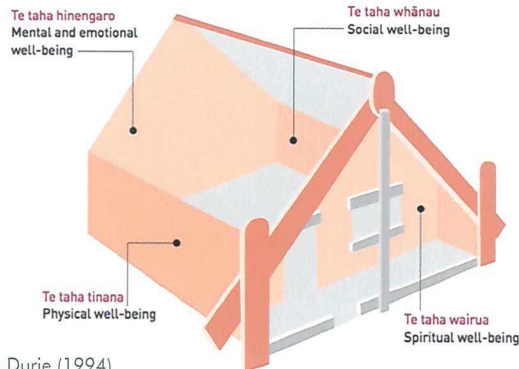
In order to access our services you must be 65 years of age and over and living within the Counties-Manukau area.

To determine eligibility, an assessment screening is done by our Cultural Needs Assessors. The criteria will be discussed with the client to determine whether eligibility has been met i.e.

- mobility
- special dietary needs
- medication
- medical issues
- level of independence or dependency
- locality
- transportation
